


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President's Message

Thornton Wilder's *Our Town* was written in the 1930s and premiered in Princeton, New Jersey, in January 1938. It opened on Broadway in February of that year, and it brought Wilder the 1938 Pulitzer Prize for drama.

Numerous actors have played the central role of the Stage Manager, among them Henry Fonda, Spalding Gray, Hal Holbrooke and Paul Newman, who made his final stage appearance in a revival of the show from December 2002 to January 2003.



The Community Players of New Hamburg are pleased to offer an accessible performance of *Our Town* on Sunday, November 10. This special presentation will feature dimmed lighting, recorded music and reduced sound levels. Patrons will also have free in-and-out privileges, allowing flexibility and comfort throughout the show. TCP is committed to making theatre accessible to all.

THE MUSIC

Thornton Wilder wanted the staging of *Our Town* to be utterly sparse: "No curtain. No scenery." Certainly no orchestra. But when the play was made into a movie in 1940, the producers asked Aaron Copland, arguably America's greatest composer, to write the score. Copland later created an orchestral suite based on his film score, which was then adapted for other instruments, including an excellent saxophone-quartet arrangement by Paul Cohen. Thus the appearance of four saxophones in Grover's Corners, New Hampshire.

The suite is in three movements, but for this production the directors have used short excerpts at various points. The third movement is played in its entirety at the end of the show.

The other music used for this production, both live and recorded, was chosen to fit the mood of the play and of 20th-century America.

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


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
