Rehearsals

Rehearsals will take place during the following scheduled times. With that in mind, we ask that everyone auditioning for this production commit to our FULL rehearsal schedule. Attendance at rehearsals is critical to the success of this production.

Please identify all potential conflicts including travel, vacation, etc on your audition form. Any conflicts with the posted schedule must be discussed with the Production Manager or Stage Manager and agreed to by the Director before casting can be confirmed.

Though we ask for full commitment to this schedule, there are likely to be some exceptions along the way. For instance, we can tell you now that there will be **no rehearsal on October 13, Thanksgiving Sunday**. Other changes will be announced as we go.

General Expectations

- Everyone who performs on stage must pay a \$20 participation fee.
- Cast members are required to provide their own makeup and hair products recommended by the hair and makeup team.
- All cast members should be available 2 hours prior to performance for make-up and hair styling.
- All company members will receive their script in advance of first rehearsal and should be familiar with their role, working towards full memorization.
- Every cast member will be emailed a "TCP Fall Show Information Kit". It will include everything you
 need to know about being part of a TCP show including how to check rehearsal schedules,
 important email addresses and more. You should carefully read and fully understand that
 document BEFORE you come to your first rehearsal.
- As a member of the company you are required to spend a minimum of 10 hours in
 pre-production activities in addition to performing on stage and rehearsing. Sometimes this is
 work that can be done at home (sewing/prop construction) or it may mean a Saturday work day
 doing painting or stage construction. As we get closer to our production dates we always require
 lots of help to transform the community center into the Studio Theatre a great time to fulfill some
 of those hours.

We ask that you come prepared to perform a one-minute monologue of your choice, and one of the "sides" available at the end of this package. Please have your monologue memorized and be prepared for some direction. The "side" you choose does not need to be memorized (in fact, we encourage you to keep your printed sides with you), but you should have a very clear understanding of the dialogue and the character you're playing. Someone from the panel will read opposite you in the side if necessary.

Summary of the Play

A Christmas Carol tells the story of Ebenezer Scrooge, a mean-spirited and stingy old man who despises the cheer and joy of those around him. On Christmas Eve he is visited by the ghost of his deceased business partner, Jacob Marley, who warns him to change his ways or face a terrible fate in the after-life.

Following this encounter, he is visited by the ghosts of Christmas Past, Present and Future. They show him the story of his life, along with the impact he has on those around him today and the foreboding future that awaits him should he fail to change his ways.

Scrooge awakes a changed man, eager to rebuild his relationships and improve the lives of those in his community.

The Characters

All **Supporting** and **Featured** roles will also be in the ensemble. They will play various minor parts in the show and also act as the narrator, telling the story directly to the audience.

Character	Role	Age	Description
Ebenezer Scrooge	Lead	45+	A stingy old man, Scrooge believes that good things come to those who earn them. He despises Christmas and doesn't see the value in wasting time or money on it.
Bob Cratchit	Supporting	25-45	A father and husband who cares deeply for his family. He works hard to provide for them despite being mistreated by his employer, Scrooge.
Fred, Scrooge's Nephew	Supporting	18-30	Scrooge's nephew and only living relative. A pleasant young man who believes in the joy of the Christmas season.
Ghost of Jacob Marley	Supporting	45+	Scrooge's deceased business partner who was like Scrooge in life. He has returned in chains to warn Scrooge about the consequences of his life decisions.
Ghost of Christmas Past	Supporting	Any	An ever-cheerful, sprightly ghost who shows Scrooge the events that led to his current state.
Ghost of Christmas Present	Supporting	Any	A jovial, larger-than-life ghost who shows Scrooge the joy, love and celebration he is missing out on.
Ghost of Christmas Future (non-speaking)	Supporting	Any	An ominous figure who speaks to Scrooge only through gestures. He shows Scrooge the consequences of his current trajectory.
Young Scrooge	Supporting	14-25	Fezziwig's apprentice, as seen in Scrooge's past
Tiny Tim	Supporting	8-12	The Cratchit's youngest son. He embodies the Christmas spirit despite being crippled since birth, bringing joy to those around him.
Two Portly Gentlemen	Featured	Any	Two affable gentlemen who have come to Scrooge's office looking for donations for the poor of London.
Fred's Wife	Featured	18-30	Less patient with Scrooge than her husband, she'd prefer an evening of games with her friends.

Mrs. Cratchit	Featured	30-45	Bob's Cratchit's wife and Tiny Tim's mother. A loving woman who tries to provide the best for her children with what she has.
Peter Cratchit	Featured	16-25	The Cratchit's oldest son. Soon to be a junior clerk at a respectable company.
Belinda Cratchit	Featured	10-20	The Cratchit's younger daughter.
Martha Cratchit	Featured	16-25	The oldest of the Cratchit children. A promising seamstress.
Mr. Fezziwig	Featured	30+	A jolly man and Scrooge's first boss, he used to throw a huge Christmas party every year.
Dick Wilkins	Featured	14-25	Fezziwig's other apprentice, working alongside Young Scrooge.
Belle	Featured	14-25	Young Scrooge's sweetheart, who tries to help him see good in the world.
First Businessman	Featured	Any	A businessman of the London Stock Exchange. The type who knows all the goings-on in London.
Old Joe	Featured	50+	A pawn dealer in London's poorest neighbourhood.
Charwoman	Featured	Any	A poor woman who used to work cleaning Scrooge's house.
Child Scrooge	Featured	8-12	Scrooge as a young child at boarding school
Fan, Scrooge's Sister	Featured	8-12	Scrooge's younger sister who has arrived at his boarding school to bring him home.
Boy in Sunday Clothes	Featured	8-12	A boy of London who meets Scrooge on Christmas day, sent on a quest to retrieve a turkey.
Additional Ensemble	Ensemble	Any	Additional ensemble members will play multiple small roles and present multiple narration sections.

The "Sides"

If the character you are auditioning for is not featured in any of the sides, please prepare the side in the style of the character.

Scrooge

I wish to be left alone! I don't make merry at Christmas. And I can't afford to make idle people merry. I support the Poor House, sir. And the Treadmill. And the Gaols. They cost enough, in all conscience. Let those who are badly off make use of such luxuries!

(Second Portly Gentleman): Many would rather die, sir. Then go to the Poor House.

If that's what they'd prefer...By all means let them do it! Why not? Decrease the surplus population. It's not my business if they'd rather die. It's enough for a man to understand his own business and mine occupies me continually. Good afternoon, gentlemen.

Belle

I understand that we can never have a home together. It will matter little. To you, very little! Another idol has displaced me. If it can cheer and comfort you in time to come - as I would have tried to do - well then, I have no just cause to grieve.

We used to agree long ago. When we thought you'd work hard and improve our position...just a little...and then we'd marry. When we agreed we were one heart! Now we are two, our agreement is fraught with misery. I won't say how often I have thought I must tell you this. It's enough, I have thought it.

(Young Scrooge): Have I ever tried to wriggle out of our bargain, Belle?

Not in words, but in changed nature. In an altered spirit. In everything that made my love valuable to you. Tell me honestly. If we had never met before, would you try and win me now - a girl without money, or the hope of money?

Spirit of Christmas Present

(Scrooge): Spirit! Tell me if Tiny Tim will live.

If these shadows are not altered, he will die.

(Scrooge): No no. Kind spirit. Let him live...

I said if those shadows are not altered, none of my kind, who come after me, will see him there. What of that? Does that concern you, Scrooge? Remember your own words. If he'd like to die, he'd better get on with it and reduce the surplus population.

Man! Forbear that wicked cant. Will you decide what men shall live? What men should die? In the sight of heaven it may be you are more worthless and less fit to live than millions like this poor man's child. Oh God! Spare us from hearing the insect on the leaf deciding there's too much life among his hungry brothers in the dust!

Boy in Sunday Clothes

(Scrooge): What's today, my fine fellow, my lad?

Boy: Today? Why, it's Christmas Day.

(Scrooge): Do you know the Poulterers in the next street but one?

Boy: I should hope I did.

(Scrooge): An intelligent boy! Do you happen to know whether they've sold the Prize Turkey that was hanging up there?

Boy: What, the one as big as me? It hangs there at this very moment.

(Scrooge): Does it indeed! Then nip round and buy it, will you? For Mr. Scrooge. Come back in less than five minutes and I'll give you half-a-crown.

Boy: I'm off like a shot!

Vocal Audition

As part of your audition, we are asking everyone to prepare approximately **20 bars or 30 seconds of a Christmas carol of your choice**. You are welcome to bring a backing track to sing along with—please ensure it is cued and ready to go at your audition time.

This is your chance to show us your vocal tone, storytelling ability, and comfort with holiday music. Choose something that suits your voice and style!

There will be both **soloist opportunities and choral components** in the production, so we encourage you to bring your full energy and character to your performance.
